Hunter Community Service Education Award*** is given annually by the Young Business Leaders of CT to a graduating student who shows exemplary grades in the classroom, above average participation in school-related activities, and has proven to be a valued asset to the community in which he/she lives or attends school. The guidelines of this award are based on the ideals of Dan Hunter, who believed in hard work, family, and serving his community. Proceeds for this award are generated through fundraisers by the Young Business Leaders of CT.

The Chamber will also be accepting applications for the **Bruce H. Kannenberg & Jonal Laboratories, Inc. Education Award.** This is a 4 year award for a **Meriden** resident graduating from a **Meriden Public School** who will be pursuing a degree in **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) or **Business**.

Please distribute these applications to interested students for completion and return them to the Chamber office no later than **February 28**, **2020**.
